Dean's Directive No. 5/2023:

Using the Tools of Artificial Intelligence in Studies at FFA BUT

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Article 1 Introductory Provisions

This internal standard reflects the importance of ethics and academic integrity when using artificial intelligence (hereinafter to as "AI") in education. The use of AI tools in creating student works¹ at the Faculty of Fine Arts of Brno University of Technology is possible only when AI is a tool for the examination and exploration of the topic or issue. In doing so, the following principles shall be followed.

Article 2

Principles of Using Artificial Intelligence in Academia

(1) The students are obliged to respect the existing rules of academic integrity when using AI, which means mainly fulfilling the obligation to quote or listing methods and instruments used in processing the assignments.

¹ Student works are outputs created in the course of studies as a response to assignments (seminar works, studio works, etc.), or partial outputs (e.g. dissertation essays) and final outputs (bachelor's, master's, and dissertation theses).

- (2) The submitted final version of student works is the result of students' creative and independent work. The assisting role of AI must be listed.
- (3) If a student thesis or a significant portion of it is found to be an unedited, uncommented, unquoted, or uncritically used and further unprocessed result of the application of AI, the thesis may be considered plagiarized.

Article 3 Final Provisions

- (1) The internal standard shall enter into force on the day listed in the heading.
- (2) This guideline may be updated depending on technological developments and the availability of AI tools in education.
